But let's go back a step. In 2004, an uprising in Qamishli, Syria, began. Many protestors were arrested. tortured, and "disappeared" in the prisons or elsewhere. Many are still missing today. Kurdish they finally took over Rojava when Bashar al-Assad's forces withdrew. Rojava means "western" in Kurdish, as in Western Kurdistan. And along the Syrian-Turkish

(HSG) emerged from the Anti-Poll Tax campaign, formed by Haringey residents with a wide range of backgrounds and views. We wanted to create a long-term, vibrant, nonhierarchical group, unlike political parties where ambitions and posturing displace real politics.

We believe in ridding ourselves of the current system which places profit and power before people's needs. This involves getting organised, fighting back and collectively taking those decisions which affect our daily lives, communities and workplaces.

We think people must take control of their community and workplace struggles, support each other, encourage practical solidarity, build the necessary skills and knowledge for those struggles and generate permanent, grassroots

Many of us are involved with| residents', community and campaign groups within the borough. We support workers in dispute, campaigns against public service cuts and threatened community amenities. We are active on environmental, housing and claimants' issues and resist oppressive policing and state

Roiavans formed the Tev-Dam, (the Movement of the Democracy together. Tev-Dam was incredibly inclusive and tried to cover every major issue in society. But rather than just a Kurdish revolution, people knew that everyone should be involved in decision making, including Arab, Muslim, Christian, Assyrian and Yazidi.

The first task was to establish a variety of groups and committees in the streets, neighbourhoods, villages and towns everywhere. resistance continued and in 2012 These groups' role was to discuss and decide upon all the issues facing society. Groups were set up to look at: women's rights, environmental. economic, education, health and care issues. trade and business, relations with foreign countries and many more. There are even groups set up to reconcile disagreements between different people, groups or factions.

Groups meet to discuss problems people have where they live. They then come together in the villages or towns in a larger group called the "House of the People". Every group or committee has two representatives and one must always be a woman.

Tev-Dam realised these areas needed to come together for making bigger decisions. So in January 2014, they set up the Democratic Self Administration (DSA) to implement and execute decisions from the "House of the People". Almost half the 22 representatives are women. It's organized so people from different backgrounds, nationalities, religions and genders can all participate.

We all saw that women took up arms to fight ISIS. But the revolution is not just about picking up weapons. Other important



changes for women have been introduced including: girls under 18 can't be married off; women's and children's rights must be recognized, protected and implemented; female circumcision is banned; equality between men and women. There are many other radical policies which would shame any "democratic" western government.

Although this revolution faces threats from a number of places it is still progressing and growing. It's also received much needed solidarity from people around the world.

We know movements and human struggles which launch a social revolution, rather than just a Association were able to buy the political revolution, are scarce building. Consider the results of austerity so far. While the price of food and housing are still rising, the benefit
